## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

Teams should be aware that failure of any member of the team to adhere to the policies and procedures listed below may result in disqualification of the delinquent student's participation and/or the entire team from the event, the entire competition, and the awards ceremony. Furthermore, any act of cheating will be promptly brought to the Competition Coordinator for review, evaluation, and imposition of possible sanctions. If someone is proven to have cheated, it is within the Competition Coordinator's power to disqualify not only the person caught cheating, but the entire team as well. The decision of the Competition Coordinator is final.

#### **Code of Student Conduct**

Connecticut Academic Decathlon expects all team members to conduct themselves in a proper manner while attending competitions. This includes travel, time on campus, and any sightseeing associated with students' participation during the competition season. Appropriate conduct of team members is the sole responsibility of the team coach who has legal responsibility as chaperone for their team members at all times. Students should be under the supervision of the coach during the entire competition.

Inappropriate conduct includes, but is NOT limited to:

- 1. using/having on person any cell phone or electronic devices in the testing areas of the competition, including Super Quiz relay;
- 2. being in possession of any weapon;
- 3. damage to, or vandalism of, any property;
- 4. appropriation of items from the competition site premises;
- 5. use of alcohol or illegal drugs by students, regardless of age;
- 6. fighting, loud noise, or any other behavior which is disruptive to others at the competition site; and
- 7. disrespect to competition officials, proctors, or coaches.

Financial liability for all damage incurred by actions of a team member shall be the sole responsibility of that team member and their guardians.

### **Testing Area Dress Code**

Although casual attire is permitted during testing, hats of any kind (except those serving religious purposes), sunglasses (except those serving medical purposes), and gorilla suits (except for those serving spiritual purposes) shall be considered inappropriate and not acceptable in the testing arena.
